CHAMPAGNE

Veuve Clicquot 'La Grande Dame' Brut, Reims, France 1998 400

One of the most distinctive brands with its bright yellow label and also one of the most historic. The wine is named after the widow who took control of the company after her husband died in 1805 and this Prestige Cuvée was launched with the 1969 vintage. The wine is typically made up of 60-65% Pinot Noir and 35-40% Chardonnay from the finest vineyards in Champagne.

Moët & Chandon 'Dom Pérignon', Épernay, France 1999 450

The original Prestige Cuvée named for the monk who accidentally discovered the secret to making sparkling wine!! The first vintage was 1921 which was released in 1936 during the Great Depression and to this day the company only produces the wine an average of 3 times per decade and ages it in their underground caves for approximately eight years before releasing it.

WHITES

Joly 'Clos de la Bergerie' Chenin Blanc, Savennières-Roche Aux Moines, France 2004 105

Nicolas Joly is one of the most passionate advocates of biodynamic principles and his wines are some of the most sought after due to their greatness and uniqueness. His wines have the ability to age for decades thanks to their combination of high acidity and fruit concentration. This wine offers peach, pear, green almond, persimmon and honey notes.

J.J. Prüm 'Wehlener Sonnenuhr' Auslese, Mosel, Germany 2005 135

Founded in 1911 and run from father to son since, Prüm's wines have a certain aristocracy owing to the truly fabulous vineyards which make up their portfolio. Illustrious names such as Sonnenuhr and Himmelreich produce wines that are the epitome of what Riesling can achieve.

Betts & Scholl Hermitage, Hermitage, France 2004 165

Betts & Scholl is a joint effort between Master Sommelier Richard Betts and contemporary art collector Dennis Scholl. Betts & Scholl have forged relationships with several wine making legends in France, Australia and the United States who are passionate about making expressive, elegant and terroir driven wines. This 2004 Hermitage Blanc is a collaborative effort between Betts & Scholl and the legendary Chave family.

Leeuwin Estate 'Art Series' Chardonnay, Margaret River, Australia 2003 195

Leeuwin was founded by the Horgan family in 1979 after receiving advice from the late Robert Mondavi. Considered to be one of Australia's finest producers, Leeuwin produces a range of fine wines with the Art Series being their pinnacle. This Chardonnay has an enviable track record of aging and is recognized as one of Australia's finest.

The Icons

REDS

Rene Rostaing 'La Landonne', Côte Rôtie, France 2004 260

Monsieur Rostaing started with just .5 hectares in 1971 and today farms a mere 6 hectares on some of the best plots of land such as Landonne. He is widely credited with putting Côte Rôtie and Syrah on the wine map along with the famous Marcel Guigal.

Jaboulet 'La Chapelle', Hermitage, France 2004 275

Certainly one of the most famous and oldest producers, the La Chapelle stands at the pinnacle of red wines made from the Syrah/Shiraz grape. Vintages such as the legendary 1961 and 1978 are still very much alive and continue to mature gracefully.

Heitz 'Martha's Vineyard', Oakville, California 2001 305

The modern day wine industry in California dates back to the early 60's when Joe Heitz, as one of the pioneers, started his winery in 1961 and who made his first Cabernet Sauvignon from this vineyard in 1966. Martha's is located in the Oakville appellation and is one of the most historical properties in Napa Valley today.

Faiveley 'Latricière-Chambertin' Grand Cru, Gevrey-Chambertin, France 2003 320

Domaine Faiveley is one of the oldest negociants in Burgundy and as such has access to grapes from some of the most prestigious vineyards. Latricière is located in the southern end of the village and is one of nine prestigious Grand Crus where limestone soils produce stunning reds with a kaleidoscope of flavours.

Antinori 'Solaia', Tuscany, Italy 2004 320

The most historic name in Italian winemaking with a continuous history of family viticulture stretching back 600 years. This wine comes from a small 10 hectare plot and is made up of 80% Cabernet Sauvignon and 20% Sangiovese and is one of the wines that started the quality revolution in the mid 1970's.

Sandrone 'Cannubi Boschis', Barolo, Italy 2004 350

One of the pioneers of the modern school of Barolo, Sandrone's wines today manage to avoid the obvious oak tones and candied fruit shown by so many wines of the new school. But the suave, seamless texture and depth of flavor of these Barolos makes them some of the most sought-after wines of the region. This wine received 98 points from Robert Parker and 95 points from Wine Spectator.

Château de Beaucastel 'Hommage a Jacques Perrin', CNDP, France 2003 525

One of the finest estates in France and the only one to use all 13 permitted varieties in the making of Châteauneuf-du-Pape. The vines average 50 years old and the yields are always very low to produce intensely concentrated, highly individual wines. The Hommage is only made in top years and is one of the most sought after collectible wines today.

Though not known for white wines, this appellation does offer very interesting drinking for the adventurous individual as it is made up of four native unique varieties---Clairette, Grenache Blanc, Bourbelenc and Roussanne. The grapes were partly fermented in oak barrels (40%) with the remainder in stainless steel to give a powerful wine full of peach, melon, hazelnuts and salted butter.
